Virge is inspired! Animals are fun. They lift her soul and give her inspiration. She loves to give them personality. They smile at you and often make you laugh.

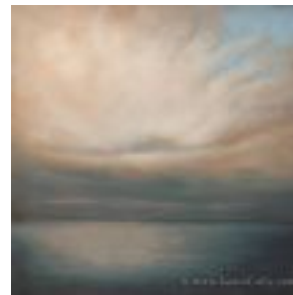

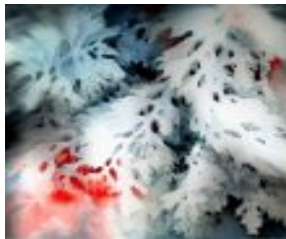
Ruddiness Complexion

Each painting is a new discovery and experience. The world is filled with limitless beauty and Priscilla's goal is to capture the sense of light and colour, internalizing it in a personal way.

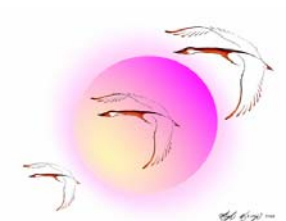

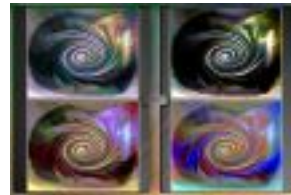
Heather O'Connor

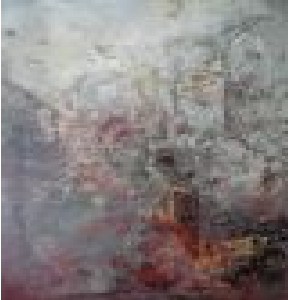


Leonardus van Bruggen III

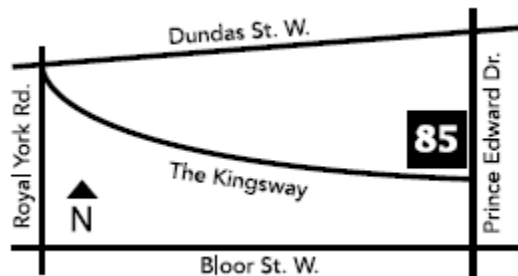


Victor Di Vincenzo
