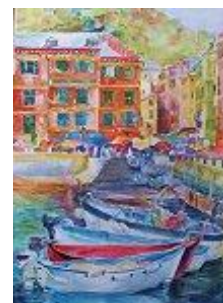
Anna Clarey

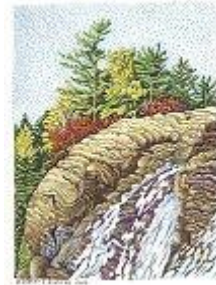


Mary Anne Dente

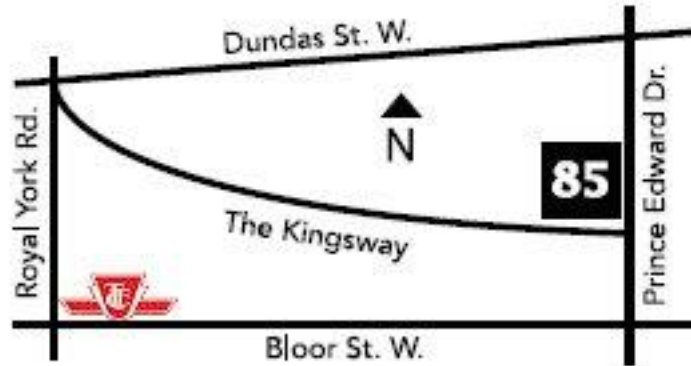
